



Electronic Recyclers International CEO to be Featured on "Going Green" Radio Show

John S. Shegerian to Describe the Importance of Recycling eWaste...and Recycling Lives on KDEE-FM Radio Program

John S. Shegerian, Chairman and CEO of Electronic Recyclers International (ERI), the nation's leading recycler of electronic waste, will be featured as an in-studio guest on Sacramento-based KDEE-FM's "Going Green Radio Show with EnviroBro," hosted by Leonard E. Joining Shegerian on the show will be his colleague, Electronic Recycling e-waste Recycling Specialist, Mandingo Cain, a man who led a life of hard times in and out of the justice system and is now a successful executive at ERI. Cain plans to share some inspiring words about his own experience.
